Musings from the manse

For those of us who like such bits of trivia the 2nd February is 'Groundhog Day', a US tradition that was unknown in the UK, until it was made famous by the 1993 film of the same name starring Bill Murray. In the film Bill Murray's character, Phil Conners, is forced to relive the same day, 2nd February, in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, over and over and over again (possibly 10,000 times!). Hence the phrase 'Groundhog Day' coming in common usage as referring to something that is seemingly repeated over and over and over again.

Do your lives of faith sometimes feel like Groundhog Day? Going over the same ground day after day. Doing the same things. Thinking surely this was the same service we had last week, the same songs, and the same sermon.

It's easy to get stuck in a rut as followers of Jesus. There's something good about routine and discipline, but there is also something that can end up becoming restrictive and limiting. What we should always grasp hold of are the words of God through the prophet Isaiah; words that remind us that with God we do not have to be left in a state of Groundhog Day in our lives of faith forever.

Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43:18-19a)

Church's Together Ecumenical Service – Held at Woodstock Methodist Church - 7pm

Kia Orana – May you live long and may you live well!

Our sisters in The Cook Islands welcome us and lead us for this year's World Day of Prayer. The Cook Islands are a tiny nation, made up of 15 Islands located in the South Pacific Ocean. Their total size is around two-thirds that of the Isle of Wight. They have a rich and colourful Māori heritage and a deep connection to nature - as seen in the painting to the right especially created for this service. However, there are challenges being severely vulnerable to climate change and the devaluing of their culture.



The Cook Island women have chosen the words

of Psalm 139 "I made you wonderful" as their theme. Through their words and stories, they invite us to recognise that God created each one of us with great attention and loving care. We should celebrate this and cherish all aspects of who we are and of those around us.

As we take part in this service, we will be joining in the great wave of prayer which encircles the globe, praying with, and for the Cook Island and its people. This wave starts as the sun rises over Western Samoa and Tonga and ends some 36 hours later back in the Pacific as the sun sets over American Samoa. Our service is at 7pm on the 7th March, at Woodstock Methodist Church. All are welcome – all ages and genders!
